


Reception Newsletter

This term our topic is:



Here are some ideas to support your child at home.

Expressive Arts and Design:

- Create winter art work or build outside if it snows!
- Encourage your child to build on their ideas when creating a picture or model. E.g. if creating a picture of a house, they could add a garden.
- Encourage your child to make and use props to support retelling the stories you have read.
- Sing and dance to a range of music from around the world and move in time to the music.

Understanding the World:

- Talk about Earth, its' continents, countries and oceans. Look at photographs and talk about experiences e.g. visiting the beach.
- Discuss with your child the similarities and differences of the UK and other countries. E.g. weather, homes etc.
- Talk to your child about the different seasons and the natural changes we see. E.g. animals, flowers, weather.

Literacy

- Practise writing short captions with correct letter formation. E.g. cat on a mat.
- Practise reading high frequency words every day with your child. Remember the 3 second rule.
- Read simple sentences in their reading book daily.
- Use Non-fiction resources to find out about our planet e.g. books, internet.
- Encourage your child to spell words independently, counting out the sounds they can hear before writing e.g. oashn (ocean).

Communication and Language

- Talk to your child about the new vocabulary they are learning in school linked to 'Our Planet'.
- Read stories linked to places around the world e.g. Meerkat Mail, Handa's Surprise, Paddington Bear.
- Encourage your child to use full sentences to express their ideas and feelings. E.g. when discussing school.

Mathematics:

- Encourage your child to subitise by stating how many objects they can see without counting up to 5.
- Practise counting 0-20.
- Encourage your child to use the language more and fewer when looking at amounts.

Messages

- Please continue to read at least 4x per week at home with your child and practise keywords as frequently as possible.
- Please ensure your child comes dressed for PE on your child's PE day.
