He grew up in a palace and lead a sheltered life. One day, he found an injured swan and nursed it back to health.

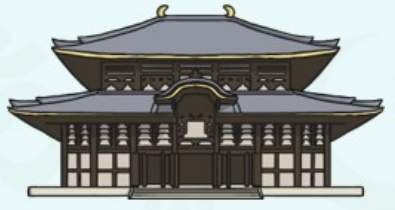

He meditated under a bodhi tree and after 6 years he found enlightenment. He taught people the 4 Noble Truths to help end suffering.

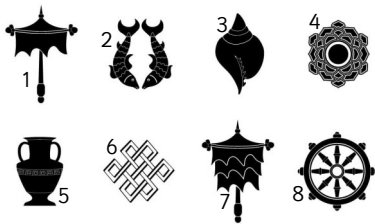
How do Buddhists worship?



Buddhists will visit a temple called a Wat on full moon days and on special religious days, like Wesak.



Buddhists usually worship at home, in front of a shrine. This will often have a statue of Buddha, some burning incense, candles, prayer beads, some food and water and a bell to engage the senses.



Buddhists will meditate in front of their home shrine as a form of worship. They may display symbols to help them focus.

1. The parasol 2. The golden fish 3. The conch shell 4. The lotus flower
5. The treasure vase 6. The endless knot 7. The victory banner 8. The wheel of life



They remove their shoes as a sign of respect and sit with their feet tucked underneath them, as it is rude to point the soles of the feet at someone.

The 3 Jewels

The Buddha, the Dharma (Buddha's teachings) and the Sangha (the Buddhist people).
